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## **INSPIRED YOUTH IS STILL ONLINE!**

The Inspired Youth Tutoring Program was again online in the 2021-2022 school year. We had six sessions per week, with some of the 32 students participating twice a week and some coming once a week. Working with the students were 32 tutors and tech people, some of whom came two or three times per week. The tutors were excellent; it was wonderful for the children and youth to be working with such good tutors.

## EPWORTH'S 3-MANUAL MOELLER PIPE ORGAN WILL BE MOVING!

Epworth's 3-manual Moeller pipe organ (bult in 1931) will be moving to a large Roman Catholic church. The church is Our Lady of the Fields in Millersville, Maryland, outside of Annapolis. Packing all the small and large pipes of the organ into individual cloth pouches is a huge task, and will take 7-10 days, beginning on July 18, 2022.

Epworth's organist, Beth P., has been so lucky (blessed) to play this organ since **1983** (with 7 years at another church in the middle). Cathy D.P. hired Beth P. in 1983 to be the organist at Epworth, and Tina S. brought Beth back in 2004.

Beth P. has loved playing this wonderful pipe organ, but we are so happy that Epworth's pipe organ will have a new home.

## WRITING ASSIGNMENTS DONE IN 2021-2022.

127 stories/articles were written by the 32 students of Inspired Youth this school year.

20 students wrote an Editorial (3 of these students wrote 2 editorials)

38 students wrote a <u>Short Story</u>, given prompts of a person, place, and problem. (4 of these students wrote 2 Short Stories; 2 more students wrote 4 Short Stories!)

27 students wrote about their <u>Favorite Teacher.</u> (2 of these students wrote about 2 Favorite Teachers.)

29 students wrote about <u>Interesting Subjects</u> in school. (5 of these students wrote about 2, 3, and 4 Interesting Subjects in school.)

13 students wrote about a <u>Career</u> that would interest them. (2 of these students wrote about 2 careers.)

Altogether this is **127** stories/articles written by 32 students of Inspired Youth.

#### **PIANO LESSONS**

This year Beth P. is giving online weekly piano lessons (individual "piano classes") to 11 students from Inspired Youth. She also gives flute lessons to one of the students. Ms. Palmer has been giving music lessons to students since 1959 (!). She enjoys it a lot and loves to see the students get better and better at playing the piano—and the flute. Most of the students will not continue with the piano; but learning to play the piano helps **the brain!** (It's true!)

In order for students to practice playing the piano, Ms. Palmer lends each family an electronic piano keyboard. Inspired Youth has a collection of around 30 piano keyboards. Some were donated, some were given to IY at a very low cost, and others were purchased by Inspired Youth, one by one, during the past 25 years. The students enjoy the piano classes.
